Spotlight on Learning



This year we have been putting a renewed focus on physical education in the Brigidines. Last year the teachers upskilled through professional development and as a result we are using the Ready Set Go resources to develop the fundamental movement skills of the students. These skills include stability - balance, locomotor - jumping, hopping, skipping, sprint running, dodging, manipulative - underarm throw, overarm throw, chest pass, catching, kicking, two handed strike. We teach the skill in three stages - discovery, developing and consolidating and then we

practice the skills through games.

Peek At What We Are Learning

This term our learning is focused on the Catholic Social Teaching principle of Solidarity. Our learning programme will also include our Zones of Regulation where we will work on using our tools to regulate our emotions. We will be growing our Te Reo, taking part in Kapa Haka, developing fundamental skills in PE and exploring ways that we can show excellence in our learning.

In our literacy learning we will focus on the individual needs of our learners in reading, writing, handwriting and phonics. We will continue to use the PRIME maths programme.

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
